WELCOME TO THE FLY-IN PROJECT

FINANCIAL LITERACY FOR YOUNG WOMEN

ADDRESSING THE FINANCIAL LITERACY NEEDS OF YOUNG NEET WOMEN TOWARDS THEIR FINANCIAL INCLUSION

The FLY-IN project has now been delivered by the five partners from Sweden, North Macedonia, the UK, Greece, and Cyprus. The project aimed to educate youth workers from various financial institutions and educational organisations with knowledge that they can use to aid disadvantaged young women and support them on how to become financially literate.

A final meeting on the 24th and 25th of January hosted with the Union-National Council for Gender Equality, discussed the evaluation of the project and reports on the management, sustainability, and finances of the project. It was also a chance for the partners to celebrate the success of the hard work put in to implement the project. Next steps for the Fly-IN project were also discussed so the work can continue to be a success by helping more young women.

The final meeting also allowed partners to discuss the key outcomes of the project which are highlighted below.

FLY-IN Curriculum

Every NEET woman (NEET - not in education, employment or training) has the opportunity to participate in free courses which have been designed to help them achieve financial inclusion, regardless of their economic condition.

Materials can be accessed through the platform by policy makers knowledge of financial management can be spread further.

FLY-IN E-Learning Portal

Free materials on the platform allow trainers to educate young people on how to set and plan goals.

We gained new contacts and built our networks of other support organisations working with migrant women and/or supporting people in this area.



The snowball effect of the 'Training the Trainers' will help to improve financial management skills in wider populations/communities.

Policy makers can use our deliverable in order to establish new training modules for trainers in this specific topic.

FLY-IN Trainers manual

Staff in our organisation gain access to research on the needs of migrant women in relation to financial literacy/financial independence/confidence.

Access to results show how the NEET women with migrant backgrounds would like to be financially independent, have access to education, and have willingness to learn.



Trainers have free access to resources, tools and training materials, meaning they can upskill themselves.

Other NGOs, and youth centres, can adapt the materials, use the learning platform to educate, and help others in need. The materials are free of charge.
